Our school will

- Ensure that Fairtrade and Fairtrade issues are embedded into the curriculum and in whole school activities

- Ensure Fairtrade is part of the School Improvement Plan
- Use Fairtrade products around the school wherever possible:

 - for PE equipment
 - at events we run in school or in the community
- Do something extra each year to promote Fairtrade
- Put this Policy into practice through a Fairtrade/ Rights Respecting Schools Steering Group which meets regularly to:
 - monitor and drive forward the school's support for Fairtrade
 - make sure everyone connected with the school is aware of this Policy and encouraged to support it
 - organise and take responsibility for Fairtrade Fortnight activities
