

## Mystery Feely Bag

Take turns with your family to secretly place interesting objects in a bag for other players to feel.

Encourage players to use as many different words as they can to describe it as they feel it.

Can they guess what it is?



# Vocabulary Activities



## Word Chains

Choose a category such as animals, food, countries, a topic you have studied etc.

The first player writes down a word linked to the category, the next player writes down a word starting with the last letter of the previous word.

Continue until no more words can be added to the chain.

For example here's an ANIMALS chain - antelope/ elephant/ tiger/ rhinoceros

## Alphabet Lists

Take turns to choose topics which interest you or you have learned about in school.

Write the alphabet as a list down one side of a page. Try to write a word linked to your topic beside each letter of the alphabet.


How many can you think of?
