


Roll the Dice

Choose a new or interesting word from your reading book, spelling list or other text.



Roll a dice to find out your challenge -

1 = Give the word's meaning.

2 = Use it in a sentence.

3 = Say a synonym (a word with a similar meaning).

4 = Say an antonym (a word with the opposite meaning).

5 = Draw a picture to represent it.

6 = Act it out.

Word Hunt

How many of these words can you find each time you read?

* A word you would like to use again.

* A word you would like to change.

* A word you have never heard or seen before.

* A word that brings the story to life.

* A word you like the sound of.

20 Clues

Take turns to choose an interesting or unusual word.

Give clues for your word to help your family guess it.

Clues could include - type of word (e.g. verb/ noun) / word meaning/ words which are similar/ number of syllables or letters.

You can only give 20 clues in total.

Vocabulary Activities

Acrostic Poems

Create an acrostic poem for a new or interesting word you have discovered.

Each line of your poem should begin with a letter from the word.

Each line of the poem should also be linked to the word's meaning (definition).
